Nursery

In nursery this week we have been creating a story map for our T4W text 'Marvin wants more' and listing all of the items he eats. We have enjoyed exploring the scene where he is in space by creating chalk pictures of planets and painting tin foil. In maths we have explored the 2D shapes circles and triangles. In phonics we have begun to learn the phoneme 'S', the children have worked very hard to form the letter 'S'. Can you find anything around the house beginning with 'S'? Our nursery rhyme of the week is 'Three little kittens'.

Reception

This week in Reception we have continued to develop our skills for writing and the rules of sentences, using finger spaces, full stops and capital letters. We introduced our new class pets of Tadpoles, where we are going to explore life cycles and their habitats. In Maths we have been looking at decomposing shapes and looking at shapes being made up of other shapes.

Year 1

In Maths this week we have been continuing to learn about fractions by focusing on finding half and quarters of objects and quantities. We could show you by cutting food to make sure it is shared fairly! In Writing we have been learning about information texts, looking at how information is split into different sections. In Geography we have been comparing geographical features of Tanzania with where we live, and we had a great time using natural materials to create sculptures earlier in the week.

Year 2

This week we have been exploring cold and warm colours in art alongside practising our paint mixing skills. In maths we have continued to work on our time telling skills looking at o'clock, half-past, quarter past and quarter to. During science we have updated our plant diaries to describe the differences between the seeds and bulbs we have been growing, our caterpillars have also begun to emerge out of their chrysalis as butterflies!

Year 3

In year 3 this week, we have been learning our new text Stone Trolls in Talk for Writing and we noticed something or someone had been living in our Greenhouse over the weekend. We have yet to discover exactly who that was! We are continuing to enjoy our text Charlotte's Web but we are a little worried about what will happen to Wilbur!

Year 4

This week we have been learning about the Mayan pyramids and comparing them to the Ancient Egyptian pyramids. We also explored the similarities between the Mayans and the Vikings, as both were Pagans but they worshipped different gods. In music we have been learning about the Beatles, we have watched videos of BeatleMania and discussed how they became so popular and who the different members were. As our performance we are learning to sing the song Blackbird.

Clickbait

While scrolling online, you'll almost inevitably have come across posts or links with headlines like "You Won't Believe These 10 Crazy Facts about ...". Such language – and the often-dubious nature of the content it promotes – has become something of a running joke on the internet. Yet while these articles are often laughed at by communities online, they can have a harmful side.

Clickbait, as it's known, can frequently function as part of a trap: intended to draw users in for the sake of advertising revenue or, in worse cases, masking an attempt to collect their personal information. The attached guide explores the various risks of clickbait and offers some top tips for evading the pitfalls of this controversial marketing technique.
