Nursery

In Nursery this week we have spotted a rabbit in our classroom, which hooked us into our new class story 'The rhyming rabbit'. We have created actions to help us retell events in the story. In maths we have been using the vocabulary 'empty' and 'full' and working practically in the water tray to explore the amounts. Our nursery rhyme of the week is 'The wheels on the bus'.

Reception

This week in Reception we began exploring our new text, Duck in the Truck. We discovered muddy footprints in our classroom and wondered who could have done them? We spotted the rhyming words in the story and talked about some of the words in the story. In maths we have been looking at numbers beyond 10 and we were blown away with how far the children could count to!

Year 1

In Maths in Year 1 this week we have been learning about equal groups and how we can them together using skip counting in 2, 5s and 10s. We enjoyed using drama to imagine a bus journey in Writing, and we made a class poem about our experience. We have begun our new topic for Geography - this week we have been focusing on our local area and we used google earth to explore it!

Year 2

This week Year 2 have begin learning about the Victorian era. Throughout the summer term, we will be learning how the life of a Victorian child was different to life now. In our writing lessons we have had some strange postcard deliveries over the last few days. Ask your child what they said...

Year 3

This week in year 3 we have settled in well after the easter holidays. The children have begun work on their new topic and have enjoyed learning about how King Tutankhamun's tomb was discovered by Howard Carter. In writing, we have written some amazing acrostic poems.

Year 5

In year 5 this week we have begun our unit of work on Politics and have explored democracy and what that means. In art, we have explored architecture across London - comparing gothic styles to Elizabethan styles. We learnt about the fire that destroyed the Palace of Westminster and the competition that was created to redesign it. We looked at the winning design and compared it to images of the building that stands today.

Year 4

This week we have been looking at different Ancient Civilisations including: Greeks, Indus Valley, Ancient Sumer, Shang Dynasty and Ancient Egypt. We have then looked at comparing the similarities and differences between these civilisations, in particular looking at the Physical Features they share and making conclusions why these are the same. We have also begun our DT topic where we are going to be learning different types of stitch in order to create a Mayan tunic - This week's stitch is running stitch. In science we have been looking at Sound and have discovered that sound is caused by vibrations and travels in waves.

Year 6

Year 6 have continued to develop their understanding of newspaper reports and are beginning to write their own based on the murder of King Duncan in Shakespeare's Macbeth. We have analysed examples of newspapers, raided the reading to collect vocab and sentence structures, created our own toolkit and learned how to use the passive voice within our sentences. In PE, we have started our new unit of athletics and had an exhausting afternoon sprinting short distances. We are working hard to reduce our times and aiming for a personal best!
